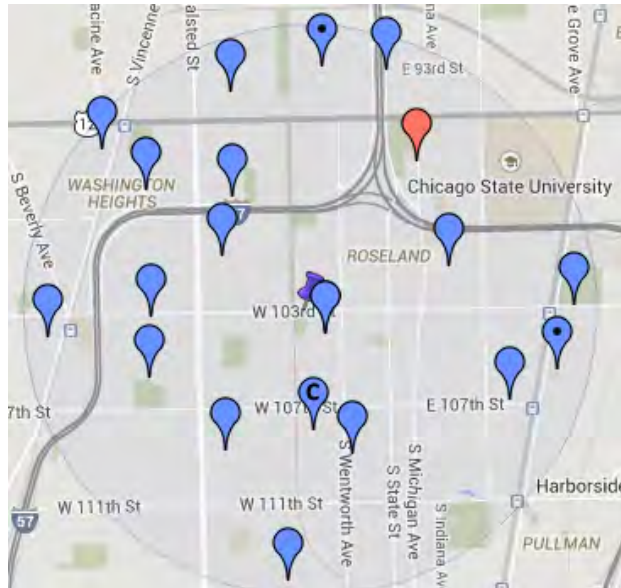
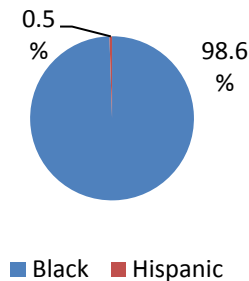
Elementary School

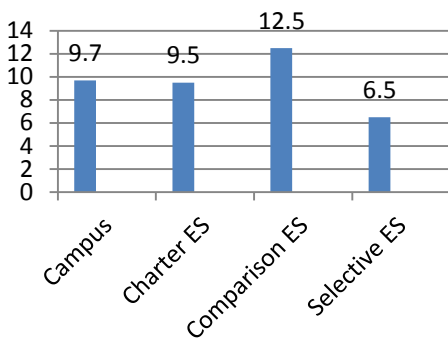

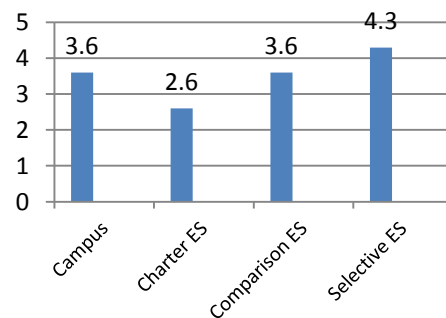

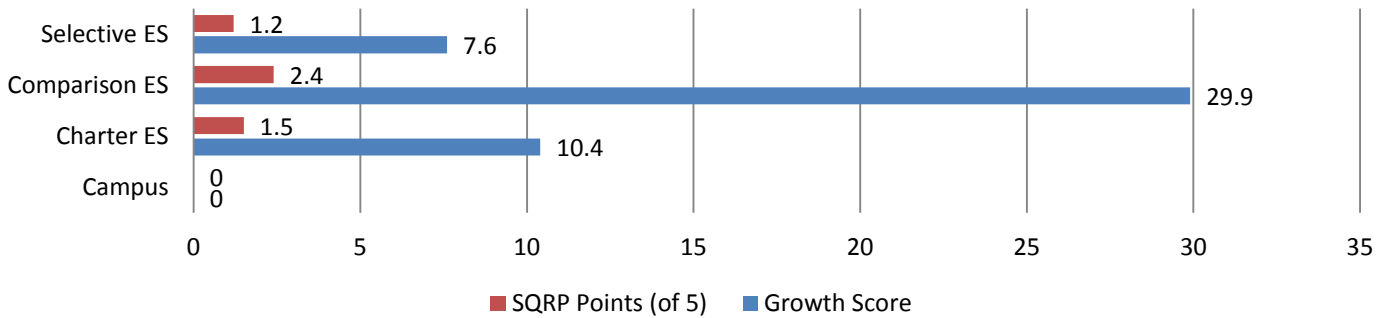
## Total Quality Score



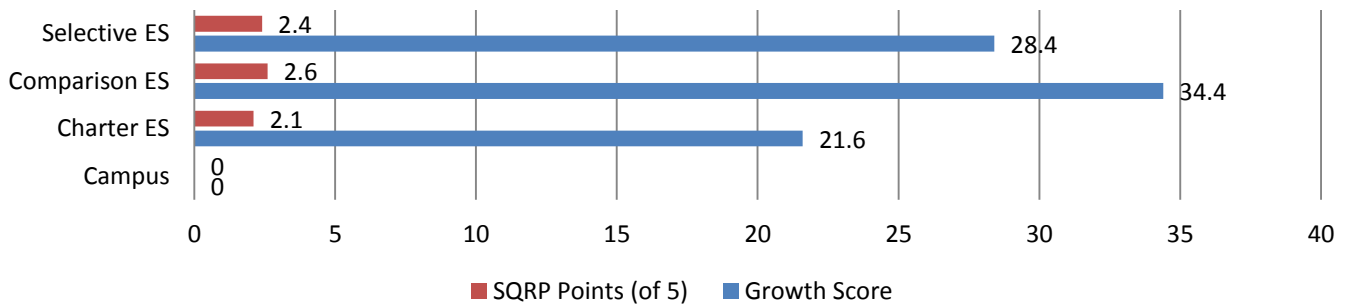

### Enrollment Trends

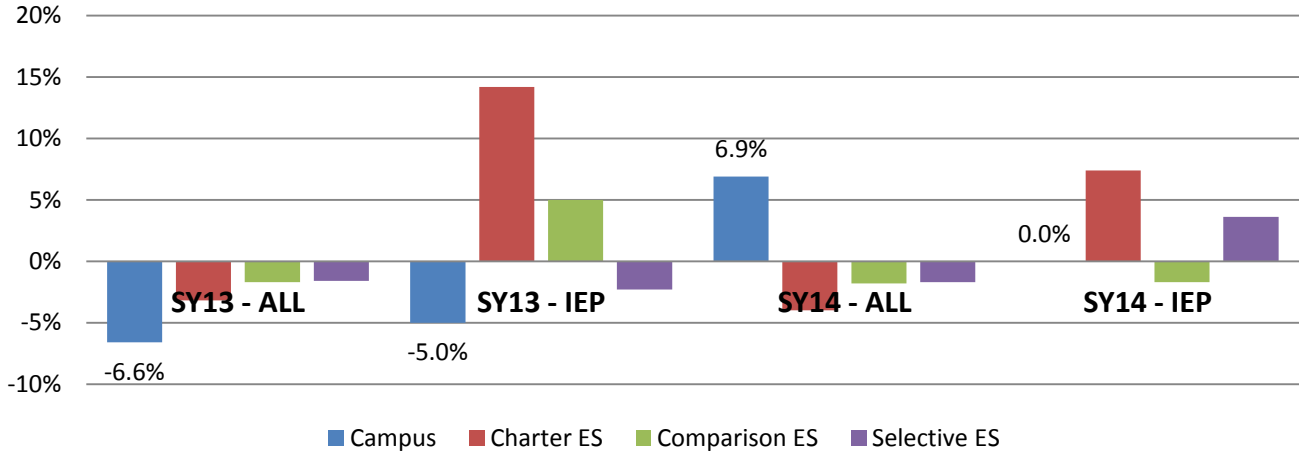

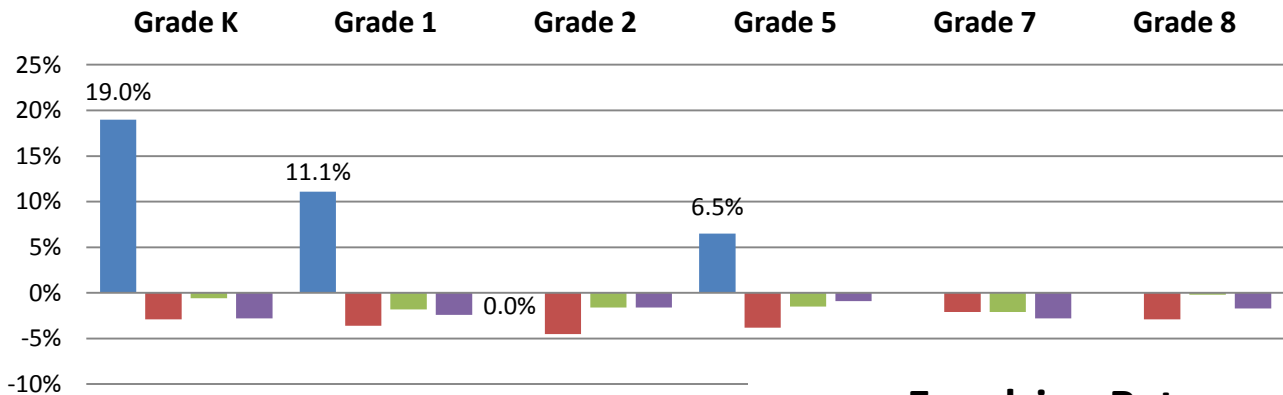

## Average Net Enrollment Change during SY 2013-14

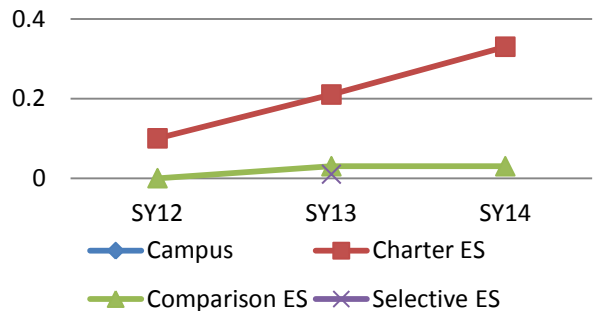
