UNIFORM POLICY

The information below serves as a guide to Foundations College Prep's uniform requirements. Foundations College Prep reserves the right to determine whether or not any part of a uniform is appropriate.

Pants:

Must be light khaki, professional, loose fitting, with belt loops on the waist.

No skinny pants, leggings cargo pants, or denim. No flaps, designs, or logos are allowed.



Shirt: Plain navy blue or a white polo shirt. All shirts must have collars. Long sleeves OR short sleeves are permitted. The shirt must remain tucked into pants at all times. Undershirts must be white or gray and should not have any visible writing or design.

No logos or designs are permitted



Shoes: Professional, closed-toe, black or brown dress show. Must be all black or all brown. During the winter, students may wear boots, but must change into their dress shoes once they arrive at school.

high heels and athletic shoes are not permitted



Belt: Must be a plain black or brown belt. Shirts must be tucked in at all times and the belts/belt loops must be visible.

No fancy or large buckles, markings, extra holes, designs, studs, etc.



Boots:

Plain black or brown

Pants must fit over the boot

Girls' boots may not have high heels

If boots are going to be wet from snow/rain, students must bring dress shoes to change into when arriving at school. Boots should be kept in their cubbies



Outerwear: a light gray, long sleeved sweater is optional during winter months. Plain sweaters only. Shirts must be tucked in under sweaters.

no sweatshirts or hoodies

jackets and other outerwear items are not a part of the school uniform and therefore must be removed and stored upon arrival at school.



Gym Uniform: Dark blue, plain athletic shorts, sweat pants, or track pants. The shorts and pants must be of an appropriate length and fit. A plain white t-shirt or Foundations t-shirt must be worn. Sneakers must be worn.

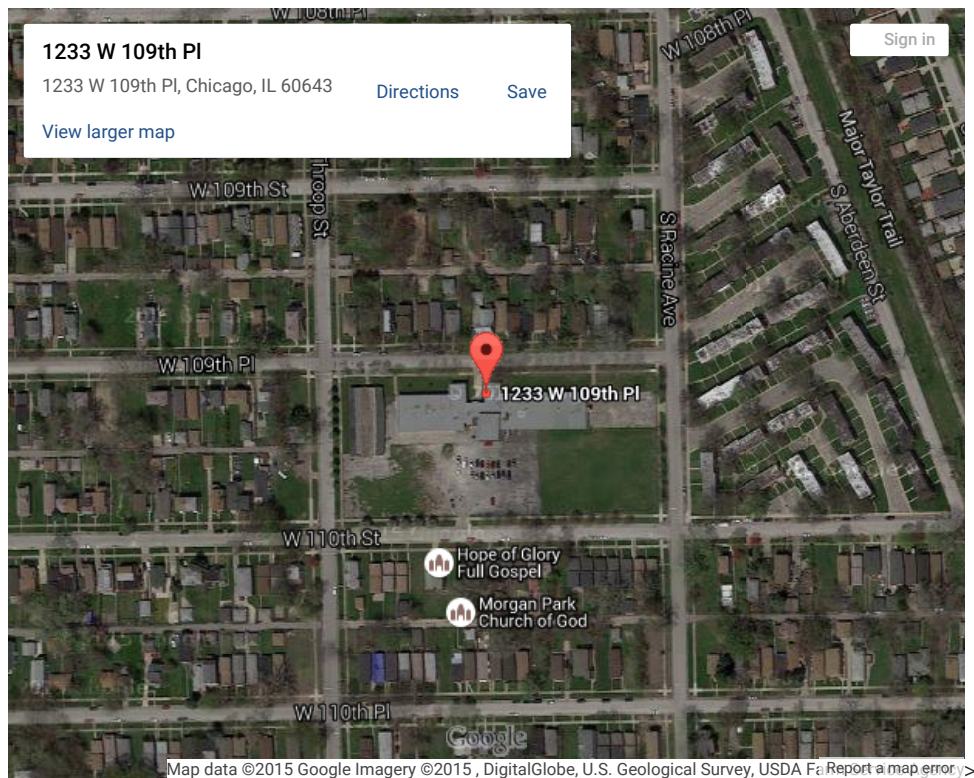
